Through this programme, the target group will be able to meet future demands while helping companies to retain their employees for longer, thus helping to address the skills shortage problem.

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2nd transnational meeting of the european project DiRECT

These educational materials will help experienced professionals to remain competitive and adapt to the demands of the modern era, where technology plays a decisive role. At the same time, there was an extensive discussion on the dissemination and communication strategy of the project, aiming to maximize its impact both at national and European level.
